About us

Vox Holloway (Latin — "the voice of Holloway") is a community choir open to all:

there are no auditions and members do not need to have experience of choral singing, read music, belong to any particular faith, or live in any particular postcode. We sing an eclectic mix of music, led by our Musical Director, Harvey Brough. Many pieces are Harvey's original compositions or arrangements - ranging from classical to jazz, pop, folk, blues and gospel. We've performed with world-class musicians in venues including Hackney Empire and Alexandra Palace Theatre. We work with professional composers, singers and musicians to commission and perform new work. We're ambitious and dynamic, but most of all, we're a friendly group who like to have fun!

The choir was founded in 2009 by Justin Butcher - actor, writer, director and musician and Director of Music at St Luke's Church, West Holloway, where we are based. Justin has written the libretto for many of Harvey's compositions, including *Freedom Song* and *The Sun Does Shine*, and is a strong supporter of Vox.

We are a registered charity and operate without grants or sponsorship for the majority of our projects.

We are funded by member subscriptions and we depend on these, alongside ticket sales, to pay the professional musicians who perform with us in our concerts. To support us, we encourage choir members to promote our concerts and bring in an audience.

St Luke's in West Holloway is our 'home' and the location of all of our rehearsals.

We are very grateful for the support provided by St Luke's in order to hold our rehearsals there each week, alongside a number of our performances.

Trustees


The choir is governed by the Committee, made up of a group of Trustees – Trustees can be found in the 'key contacts' section at the end of this pack.

Patrons


Harvey has selected patrons who we have the greatest admiration for, with community in their hearts - and perhaps in their work too.

The music we sing

We are fortunate to have our own composer and arranger in our Musical Director **Harvey Brough**, one of the UK's most accomplished and diverse musicians.

Harvey is unique in his ability to work with the finest professional musicians and complete beginners (both children and adults), often side by side. He has been promoting Community music for many years before it became a popular movement.

Many of his compositions bring these forces together, with remarkable results. Under his leadership, Vox has worked with the Kinks' Ray Davies, The Specials' Jerry Dammers, Brazilian superstar Monica Vasconcelos, Catalan composersinger Clara Sanabras and jazz legend Liane Carroll.

We have also performed a number of classical pieces – most recently including Faure's *Requiem in D Minor* and Britten's *A Ceremony of Carols*, amongst others.

Subscription fees

Fees for the term are £75 – including rehearsals, score, audio aids and the concert. Please speak to us about a reduced rate if this would support you to join.

Vox is able to reclaim Gift Aid on your subscription and any donations you make. This is hugely valuable and is very simple for the donor. So if you are a UK tax-payer please speak to Vox Treasurer, Jon Sedgwick (email voxn7treasurer@gmail.com), who can explain how it works and obtain the small amount of additional information we need from you.

Membermojo

This is the system we use to manage membership information – and so it's important that we have up to date and accurate contact details for you. Please click on the 'view or change membership details' link below to review the records we hold and make sure they are correct and complete, in particular that you have advised us of which voice part you sing (alto, soprano, bass, tenor – and if you aren't sure, we can support you with discovering this). This is really important as it affects the seating plans for concerts.

Please also check we have a telephone number for you and details of someone we can contact in an emergency. We always hope it won't happen but we do need to know who to call if something happens - or if you leave your phone behind at a rehearsal.

Logistics

Rehearsals are on Tuesday evenings at St Luke's, Hillmarton Road, Holloway, N7 9JE. All rehearsals begin at 7.30pm and end at 9.30pm with a tea/wine break in the middle.

Audio aids

We rehearse with printed scores, plus access to real voice audio aids recorded by Harvey. These are available on our website, with the link circulated to members each term. We ask that choir members work hard to learn the music to make best use of rehearsals.

Frequency


We have three terms per year, corresponding to the school terms. Our performances consist of one, or sometimes two, concerts per term.

Venues

Our concerts either take place at St Luke's West Holloway, our 'home' where we rehearse, or once or twice a year we perform in another venue. Recently we have performed at Hackney Empire, Alexandra Palace Theatre and Sinfonia Smith Square.

Concert day

On the day of the concert, we normally have a full rehearsal with band and soloists. We'll communicate the timings and logistics of this well in advance.
